

Parliamentary Motions Match-Up

Based on *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (10th Edition)*

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| ___ Point of Information | a. demands a rising (but not counted) vote after a voice vote |
| ___ Amend | b. places a limit on the time or number of speakers |
| ___ Parliamentary Inquiry | c. allows a matter to be sent to a smaller group to consider and report back |
| ___ Division of the Assembly | d. “kills” main motion |
| ___ Rescind/Amend Something Previously Adopted | e. delays consideration of a matter |
| ___ Point of Order | f. ends debate immediately |
| ___ Adjourn | g. permits a short break |
| ___ Recess | h. allows a member to ask a question relevant to business (but not procedure) |
| ___ Previous Question | i. calls attention to an error in procedure |
| ___ Table | j. allows a member to ask a procedural question |
| ___ Appeal | k. temporarily delays a matter when something of urgency arises |
| ___ Postpone Indefinitely | l. brings business before the assembly; permitted only when no other motion is pending |
| ___ Refer | m. revisit motion already voted on at same meeting |
| ___ Postpone | n. strikes or modifies motion adopted at prior meeting |
| ___ Limit/Extend Debate | o. allows modification to another motion by adding, deleting, or changing words |
| ___ Reconsider | p. takes decision from chair and gives to assembly |
| ___ Main Motion | q. ends the meeting |
