Purpose	The 21 st Century Community Learning Centers provide students with academic support in mathematics, language arts and writing using a combination of tutoring, small group instruction, interactive technologies, recreational activities, mentoring and field trips.	The Saturday Academy provides an opportunity for students in grades 3-5 at Priority and Focus schools to strengthen reading and math skills from the previous marking periods. Students also work through weekly science labs with the Virginia Air and Space Museum.	The Achievable Dream Summer Program provides a jumpstart for students in reading, mathematics and science through a four week pre-teaching of content for the subsequent year. Students spend four weeks with their teacher for the following school year.	The Elementary Summer Learning Lab is an innovative approach to ignite learning for both students and teachers. Students have an opportunity to preview and experience the upcoming year's science content and standards while revisiting crucial reading, writing, and math skills that will serve as a foundation for the students' future success.
