Student School Board Representatives Awarded VSBA Exhibitors Scholarships

The scholarship, funded by exhibiting companies at the VSBA's annual convention, was made available to spring 2021 graduating seniors who had served as student school board representatives. *Ameresco* and *Schneider Electric* sponsored this year's scholarship program, which is in its eighth year.

When asked what receiving the scholarship meant to him Cestaro said, "I am very grateful to have been chosen to receive this scholarship. It brings immense pride to be recognized for my academic achievement and leadership roles within the highly-ranked Virginia public schooling system." Diaz Karhnak replied, "Receiving the VSBA Exhibitors Scholarship is a great honor and, as I believe it to be, an even greater testament to the value of putting others before oneself.
