


Government Relations

On November 8, 2022, the future of Virginia's Congressional Delegation will be determined when votes are counted across the Commonwealth. This year's Congressional Elections feature newly drawn legislative districts based on data from the 2020 United States Census.

The Virginia School Boards Association is providing this guide to assist with researching the candidates seeking election to the United States Congress. In the table below, each of the candidate's websites are linked to learn about their stances on issues important to our communities.

It is important to remember in the Commonwealth of Virginia, election law allows voters to begin voting in-person 45 days prior to the date of the November election. In 2022, voters can head to the polls on September 23, 2022, and early voting ends on November 5, 2022. To find an early voting polling location or to request a mail in ballot, please contact your local registrar, or visit the Virginia Department of Elections for information on casting a ballot.
