2024 VSBA Student Essay Contest

PURPOSE

This contest is designed to give high school students in Virginia an opportunity to express creative ideas and concepts, conduct research, think critically, practice public speaking skills, and subsequently receive recognition. It also presents a golden opportunity for our Conference on Education attendees to witness firsthand the remarkable caliber of students from across the Commonwealth, providing a vibrant showcase of excellence in education.

The Virginia School Boards Association is holding a personal essay/speaking contest where the first place winner will have the opportunity to present their essay before an audience of more than 200 school board members and administrators at the 2024 VSBA Conference on Education held July 23 at Hilton Richmond Hotel & Spa at Short Pump. In addition, the first place student has the option to attend and present their essay at the 2024 Student School Board Representative Workshop held at the 2024 VSBA Annual Convention November 20-22 at the Williamsburg Lodge in Williamsburg, Virginia.

This is the fourth year the Virginia School Boards Association will hold this contest. We hope that this contest will bring out the very best in students' writing and speaking efforts and allow our attendees to witness examples of bright, thoughtful, and accomplished students from around the state.

TOPIC

Kind Hearts, Strong Schools – Please prepare a personal essay discussing how kindness plays an important role in the learning environment, and how decisions and actions contribute to fostering kindness in schools. Highlight the role of kindness in creating a positive and supportive educational environment. Kindness is at the root of our beliefs and the core of our society.

ENTERING THE CONTEST & REGISTRATION DEADLINE

This contest is open until 4:00 p.m. on May 6, 2024, to all 2023-2024 school year high school (9-12) students who are enrolled in school divisions that are current members of the Virginia School Boards Association. The application process must be completed in its entirety **online no later** than 4:00 p.m. Monday, May 6, 2024. Receipt of applications will be time-stamped by VSBA.

Applicants must submit a complete application containing ALL the following items by the date shown
above to be part of the contest:
☐ An application form (application at this link: 2024 VSBA Student Essay Contest Submission Form)
☐ A 600-750 word personal essay
☐ A video of the essay presented as a speech
☐ A completed and signed Parental Release Form (see page 6 of this document)

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR PRESENTATION TO VSBA

All of the required materials listed in the section above must be submitted through the submission form no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, May 6. 2024. The video portion of the submission must be submitted through a YouTube, Google Drive, or Dropbox link through the submission form. Remember that partial submissions will not be considered for participation in the contest, so please ensure all four items are included with your online submission.

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RECOGNITION

The contest offers the following incentives:

The first place winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship, sponsored by WellNet Healthcare, and certificate to be presented at the **2024 VSBA Conference on Education**, held on **July 23, 2024**. Attendance at this conference is **required** and the winner will present their essay as a speech and receive recognition. The location of the 2024 VSBA Conference on Education is:

RULES AND GUIDELINES

- All entrants must be classified as a high school student (grades 9-12) during the 2023-2024 school year.
- The school where they are enrolled must be a public high school in Virginia in a division that is a current member of the Virginia School Boards Association.
- By entering, the student agrees to present their essay/speech at the VSBA Conference on Education (required) if chosen as the first place winner. This is required to receive the cash award. The student has the option to attend the 2024 VSBA Student School Board Representative Workshop
- Although this is meant to be a personal, rather than an academic essay, attention should be given to content, organization, style, and correctness.
- Essays/presentations must be original. However, consultation with teachers or other resources is encouraged. Plagiarism is not acceptable.
- Credit must clearly be given to any source where borrowed material is directly used or quoted.
- Essays should be approximately 600-750 words in length (appropriate for 4-5 minutes of speaking) and on the topic: Kind Hearts, Strong Schools.
- A video of the presentation in its entirety must be submitted with this application.
- Presentations should be memorized, but students may use 3x5 note cards as references during their presentations. Presentations may not be read in entirety from a manuscript or notes.
- Presentations must be approximately four to five minutes in duration.

JUDGING

The winner will be selected by a panel of judges chosen by the Virginia School Boards Association. Criteria for judging the essays and the presentations include quality of the written essay both in form and content and student delivery qualities as demonstrated in the video. Accuracy of facts; demonstrated mastery of the topic, effective communication of concepts, thoughts, ideas, proper use of voice and articulation, and originality are all important. A sample of the judging worksheet can be found on the next page. The decisions of the judges are final
