# 2026 VSBA Student Essay Contest

## **PURPOSE**

This contest is designed to give high school students in Virginia an opportunity to express creative ideas and concepts, conduct research, think critically, practice public speaking skills, and subsequently receive recognition. It also presents a golden opportunity for our Conference on Education attendees to witness firsthand the remarkable caliber of students from across the Commonwealth, providing a vibrant showcase of excellence in education.

## **RULES & GUIDELINES – Please print and distribute as needed**

The Virginia School Boards Association is holding a personal essay/speaking contest where the first-place winner will present their essay before an audience of more than 200 school board members and administrators at the 2026 VSBA Conference on Education held July 16 at the Wyndham Virginia Beach Oceanfront Hotel in Virginia Beach.

This is the sixth year the Virginia School Boards Association will hold this contest. We hope that this contest will bring out the very best in students' writing and speaking efforts and allow our attendees to witness examples of bright, thoughtful, and accomplished students from around the Commonwealth.

## **TOPIC**

**Rooted in Public Education** – Public education shapes who we become. In an essay, describe how your public school experience has helped shape your identity, your goals, or your sense of belonging. How are you “rooted” in public education, and how has it helped you grow?

## **ENTERING THE CONTEST & REGISTRATION DEADLINE**

**This contest is open until 4:00 p.m. on Monday, May 4, 2026**, to all 2025-2026 school year high school (grades 9 - 12) students enrolled in school divisions that are current members of the Virginia School Boards Association. The application process must be completed in its entirety **online no later than 4:00 p.m. Monday, May 4, 2026. Receipt of applications will be time-stamped by VSBA.**

To be part of the contest, student applicants must submit a complete application containing ALL the following items by the date shown above:

- ☐ A 600-750 word personal essay
- ☐ A video of the essay presented as a speech
- ☐ A completed and signed Parental Release Form (see page 6 of this document)

## **HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR ESSAY AND VIDEO TO VSBA**

ALL the required materials listed in the section above must be submitted through [the online submission form](#) no later than **4:00 p.m. on Monday, May 4, 2026**. The video portion of the application must be submitted through a YouTube, Google Drive, or Dropbox link through [the online submission form](#). Remember that partial submissions will not be considered for participation in the contest, so please ensure all four items are included with your online submission.

**When submitting your video link, it is important that the privacy settings of the video be set to public. If the video is not a publicly viewable link by the May 4 deadline, the submission will be disqualified.**

## **RECOGNITION**

The contest offers the following incentives:

The first-place winner will receive a **\$1,000 award**, sponsored by Haney Phinyowattanachip, PLLC, and a certificate to be presented at the **2026 VSBA Conference on Education**, held on **July 16, 2026**. Attendance at this conference is **required** and the winner will present their essay as a speech and receive recognition. The location of the 2026 VSBA Conference on Education is:

## **RULES AND GUIDELINES**

- All entrants must be classified as a high school student (grades 9-12) during the 2025-2026 school year.
- The school where they are enrolled must be a public high school in Virginia in a division that is a current member of the Virginia School Boards Association.
- By entering the contest, the student agrees to present their essay/speech at the VSBA Conference on Education if chosen as the first-place winner. This is required to receive the award.
- Although this is meant to be a personal, rather than an academic essay, attention should be given to content, organization, style, and correctness.
- Essays/presentations must be original. However, consultation with teachers or other resources is encouraged. Plagiarism is not acceptable.
- Credit must clearly be given to any source where borrowed material is directly used or quoted.
- Essays should be approximately 600-750 words in length (**appropriate for 4-5 minutes of speaking**) and on the topic: ***Rooted in Public Education***.
- A video of the presentation in its entirety must be submitted with this application.
- Presentations should be memorized, but students may use 3x5 note cards as references during their presentations. **Presentations may not be read in entirety from a manuscript or notes.**
- Presentations must be **four to five minutes** in duration and videos must be made for public view so that judges are able to view them.

## **JUDGING**

The winner will be selected by a panel of judges chosen by the Virginia School Boards Association. Criteria for judging the essays and the presentations include quality of the written essay both in form and content and student delivery qualities as demonstrated in the video. Accuracy of facts; demonstrated mastery of the topic, effective communication of concepts, thoughts, ideas, proper use of voice and articulation, and originality are all important. A sample of the judging worksheet can be found on the next page. **The decisions of the judges are final.**

- Uses body movements appropriately (gestures, eye contact, facial expressions, posture)
